Introduction

In the intricate realm of Venture Capital, access has often seemed a privilege reserved for a select few, requiring a finely balanced mix of experience, networks, and a touch of serendipity. However, for the Latino community, this challenge has frequently been an even more formidable endeavor.

Within the upcoming pages, we focus on highlighting the historical and influential presence of the Latino community in the realm of Venture Capital (VC).









Methodology

In this report, we've compiled a database of Latino venture capital firms, emerging managers, and entrepreneurs.

Our data comes from multiple sources. We largely leveraged Crunchbase, Pitchbook, Beta Boom, Forbes, as well as Harlem Capital's internal data.

For the scope of this report, we use 'Latino' consistently but while collecting data focused on Hispanic and Latino individuals. We also refer to founders of VC firms as emerging managers throughout this report.





Key Findings

- 1) Since 1999 there have been 75+ funds raised by Latino emerging managers
- 2) 41% of all funds had an HQ in California, 19% in New York, and 12% in Florida, with the remaining funds having <10% concentration in one state
- 3) 70%+ of funds were launched by one or two emerging managers, 49% were launched solely by men, and 70%+ have a focus on early stage investing
- 4) There were multiple Latino startups in the 1990s, including Brightstar which reached unicorn standing in 2013 (valued at \$2.2bn)
- 5) The 2000s saw continued development in emerging managers, including Latina women whose firms have made over 400 investments and have had over 80 exits










Latino Population in the U.S.



Since 1999 there have been at least 75 funds raised by Latino emerging managers




Funds by Geography




Fund Managers by Gender


49% launched solely by men

There were multiple Latino startups in the 1990s, including Brightstar which reached unicorn standing in 2013 (valued at \$2.2bn)

Unicorn:



- The world's leading provider of mobility and logistics services for managing devices and accessories across the wireless ecosystem
- Founded in Miami in 1997 by Marcelo Claure
- Acquired in 2013 by Softbank who paid \$1.26 billion for a 57% stake in the company, valuing the entire company at \$2.2 billion.
- Recently rebranded as "Likewize," the company now provides a range of tech services


