


Introduction

This is our 2024 Diverse VC Report, which features 550 Black and Latino US-based VC investors across 406 different funds.

When we first began tracking in 2018, we were only able to feature 200 investors.

Although progress is being made, most funds have an opportunity to improve representation of Black and Latino investors. It is our hope that this report inspires more funds to join our list.






Key Findings

1) Overall number of investors in our report increased by 76% to 550 (up from 312 in our 2022 report)

2) 68% of new additions were Latino investors, bringing overall share of Latino investors to 51%

3) 64% of the investors in our report are in senior roles, down from nearly 80% in 2022, though Black men continue to make up the largest share of senior investor roles

4) Despite progress being made, 11 funds (out of 406) account for 10% of all Black & Latino investors in our report







How did we do it?

Methodology

- Revisited our last Diverse VC report to account for industry and role changes
- Identified additional investors through web scraping, selfreported diverse VC directories, and HCP's investor network


Criteria for inclusion

- US-based
- Non-investing roles (e.g., platform, advisory) not included
- Scouts, fellows, and venture partners not included


Our report features 550 US-based Black and Latino VC investors

51% of the investors in our report are Latino, and 49% are Black




68% of new additions to the report were Latino investors



Though gender distribution remained similar, Black investors now represent 49% of our tracker (compared to 71% in our 2022 report)


Investors continue to be primarily located in SF and NYC

% of investors in each city




51% of investors were located in SF + NYC (up from 47%); Miami appeared in the top city list for the first time

Of the 312 investors in our 2022 report, we tracked...




64% of the investors in our report are in senior roles


